Time: 21 total hours of lecture and practicum over three days, including the opportunity to practice EMDR therapy (upon completion of Part 1 training) with certain clients.

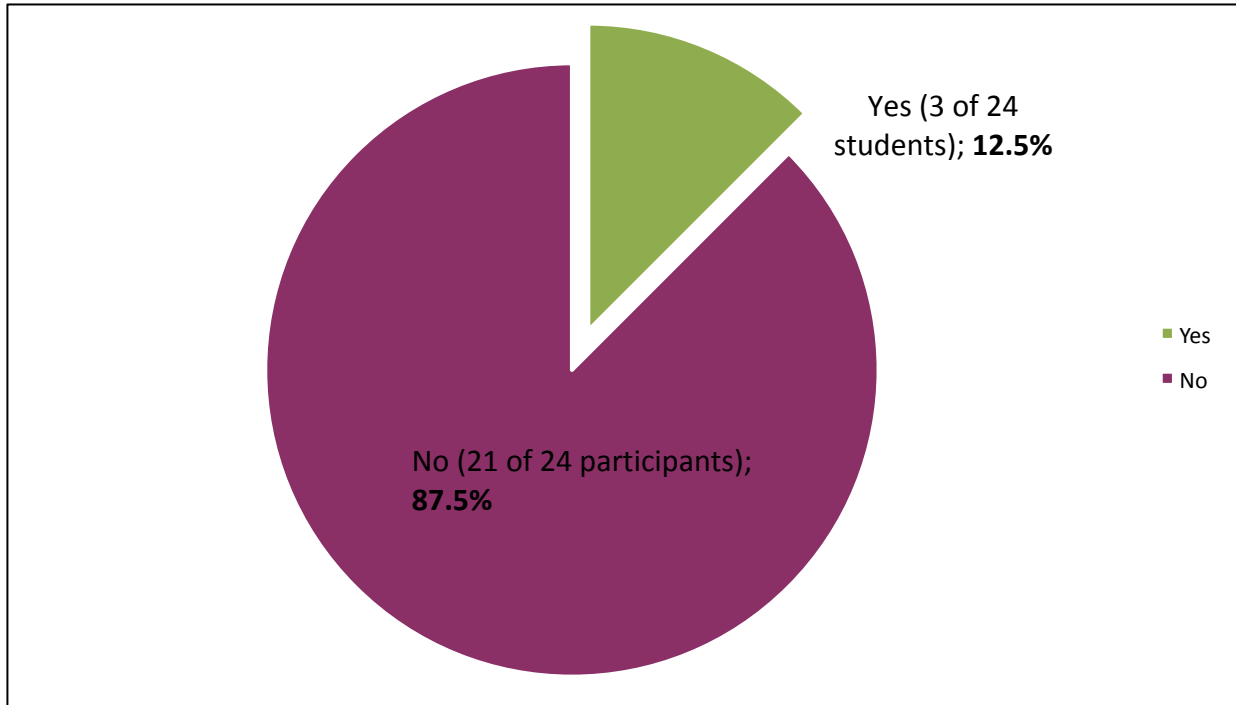

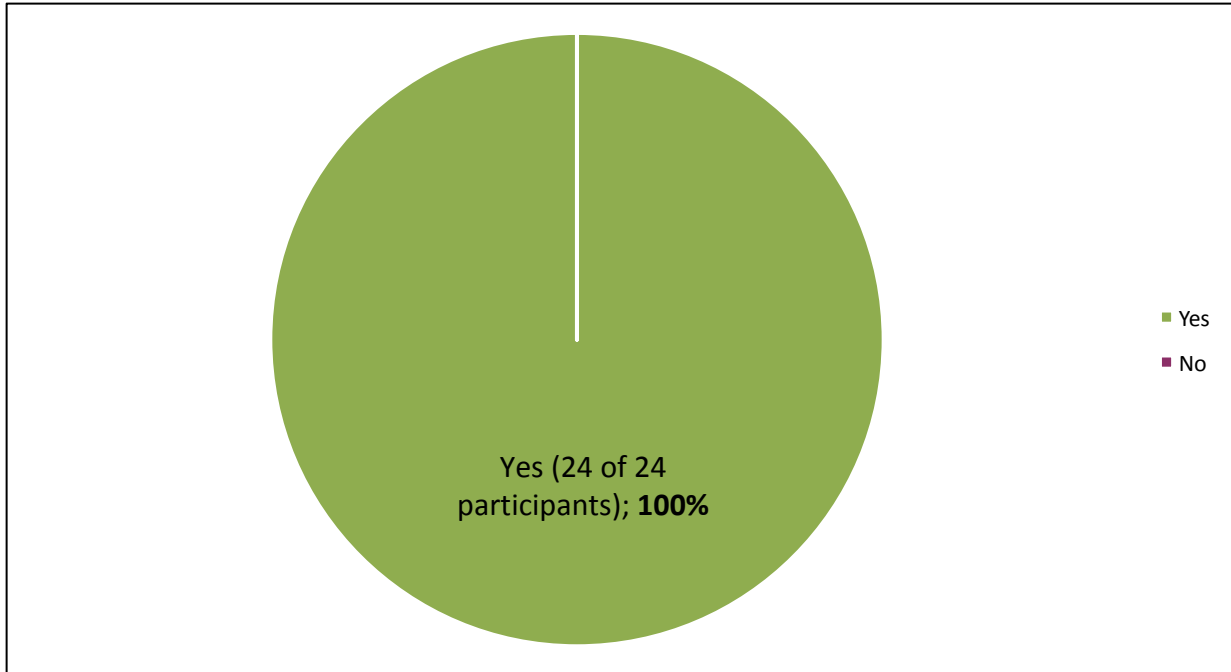

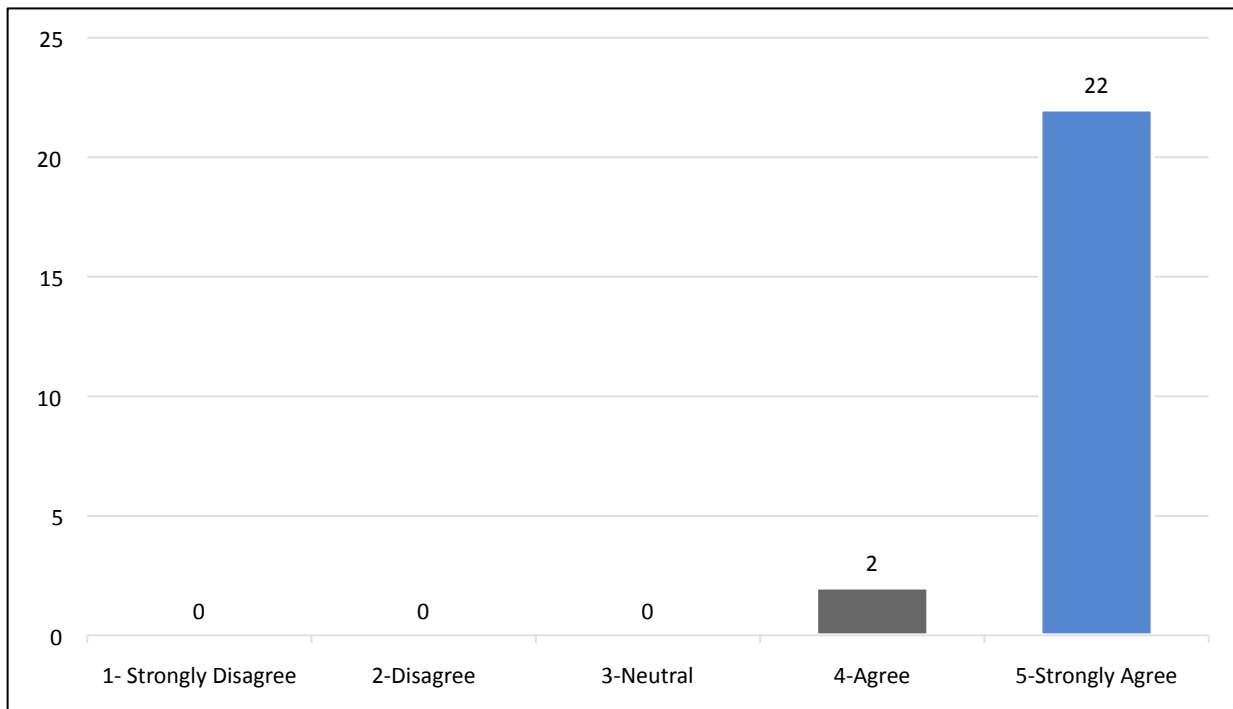

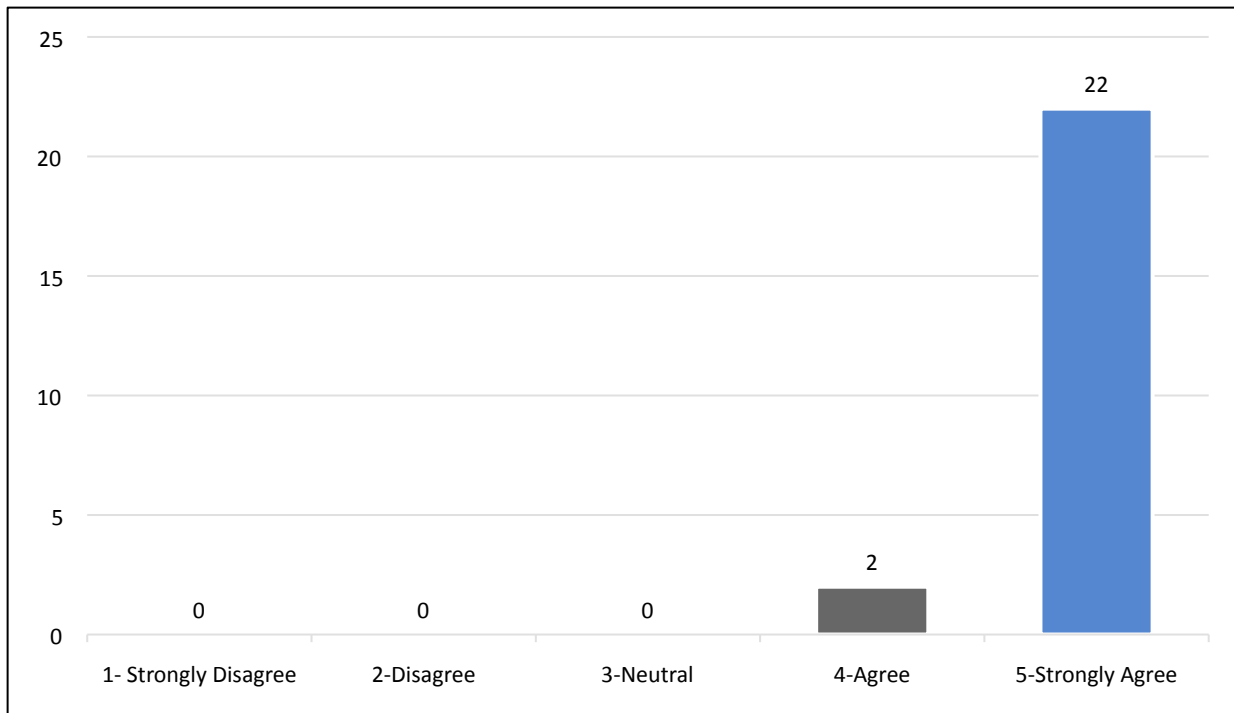
